The club has a very family friendly ethos and atmosphere where we ensure that all players on the bench get game time not just the starting five, parents bring some great support to the games and encourage all members of the squad.

Much of the growth has come through word of mouth and parents who have seen the club on social media.

Social media has its place well and truly now in ensuring the club has its presence and voice in the basketball community and wider and its great to see how this can help promote the achievements of the club and its activities.


If there is one thing you could suggest the YBL could do to improve? Is so, what would this be?

I am going to be bold and give you three ideas;

1. The CVL format for under 9's and under 11s has been a resounding success; it would be great however if this could be a little more flexible as at this age group children are often trying out new activities during the season. Would it be possible to explore each CVL being more of a stand alone opportunity perhaps with a deadline for entry a couple of weeks before the day to give more opportunity. In addition, one or two more of these events during the season please.

- **2.** There is a shortage of referees this season partly due to the growth of the YBL, its great to see the new opportunities for interested parties to gain their qualifications already announced by the YBL. It would be helpful and give more confidence to clubs if in addition to this some continual development of the officials to referee to try and ensure more consistency across the leagues perhaps by appointing a lead official who can travel to games and give critique and feedback along the lines of what happens at BE regional events. This would hopefully give a greater degree of consistency across all leagues.
- **3.** Across some of the junior leagues there appears to be a some very different standards could you consider looking at the format of the leagues going forward to both even out the numbers of teams as the under 15 leagues have 11 in the west but only 8 in the east and also deal with the standards as teams winning or losing with a' blow out' does not do anything to help with the longer terms development of the young people involved.

Finally, from all at the club we would like to say a big thank you to James & Kim for all you do to run the YBL for all the teams. Without both of you we would not be able to have such a great set of leagues for our members to enjoy their basketball and compete with in.

The YBL are pioneering the first U.K. development league for wheelchair teams to participate in.

With the support of BWB (British Wheelchair Basketball), this first development weekend focuses on brand new players, returning players and the officials for the game.

The YBL warmly welcomes; Worcester Wolves, Bromsgrove Blaze Hotshots, Bradford Bears, Birmingham Eagles, Jaguars and The Bears into the YBL family.

The teams will be split into two groups where over the course of this weekend they'll play each other once. When they next meet up at the tournament in February 2020 they will battle aiming to finish in the top two position s of their group to secure a place in the YB Championship Semi-Finals in May 2020.

The games are not just about the 'W', they are all about getting everyone on the court to learn more about the game, the rules and the camaraderie of their teams and the groups around them. All within the spirit of the YBL principles. To have fun!
